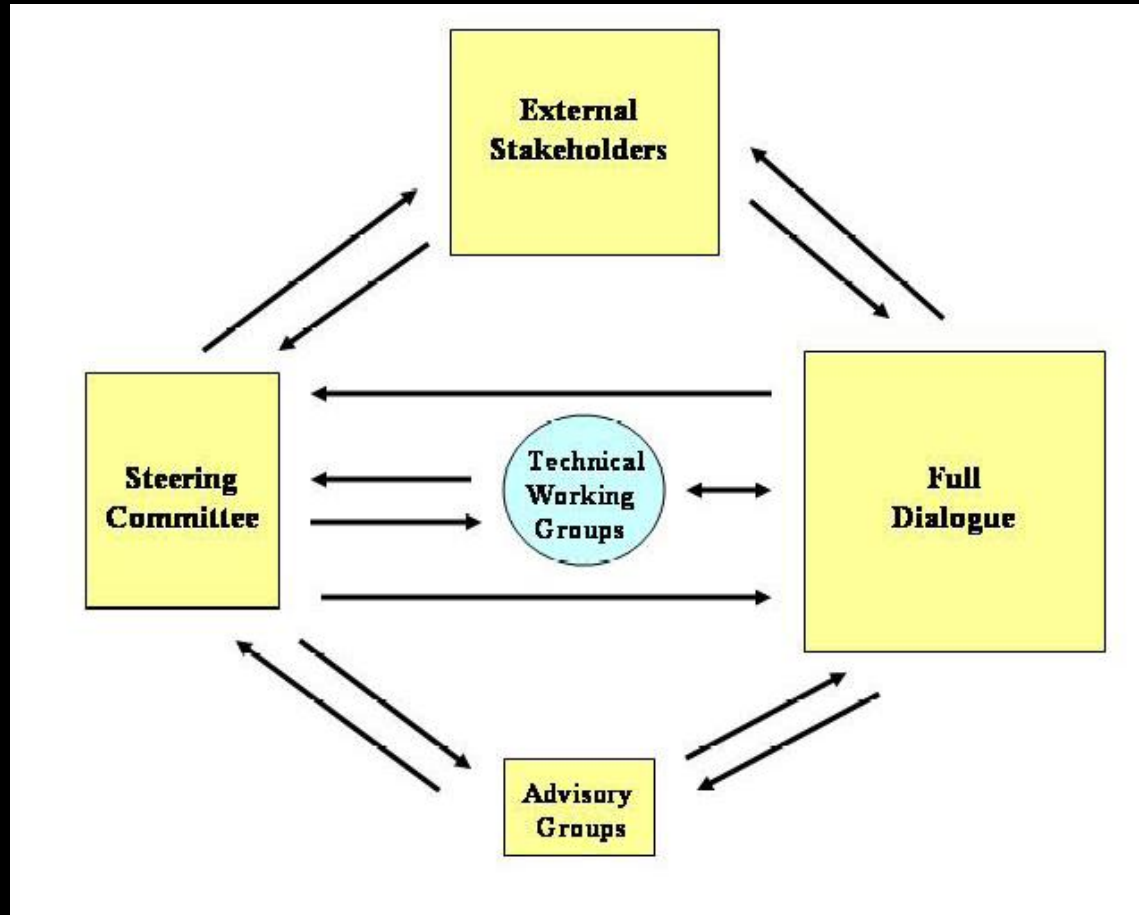

Level of implication in an Aquaculture Dialogue





All stakeholder can find a room to participate

- Full Dialogue

- A larger group of stakeholders interested in the dialogue and committed to support its goals and objectives. They can participate, review and comment on the progress toward the goals and objectives and products of other groups.

- Technical Working Groups

- It is composed of researchers and scientists with expertise in identified areas of impact.





All stakeholder can find a room to participate

- Advisory Groups

- offer advice on particular aspects and results of the dialogue process or to provide collective input on their needs as a stakeholder group. (e.g. retail advisory committee or government advisory committee)

- External Stakeholders

- Individuals who do not directly participate in the dialogue, but are free to comment and provide input on dialogue reports.





Steering Committee will drive the dialogue

- Serves as the prime decision-making body
- Is inclusive of multiple sectors and regions
- Each Dialogue steering committee must agree upon and document their decision making process.





Steering Committee members

- Open to any stakeholder
- Balanced of industry and non industry leaders
- Maximum of 10 people
- Member commit time and some money
- All modern means of communication will be used

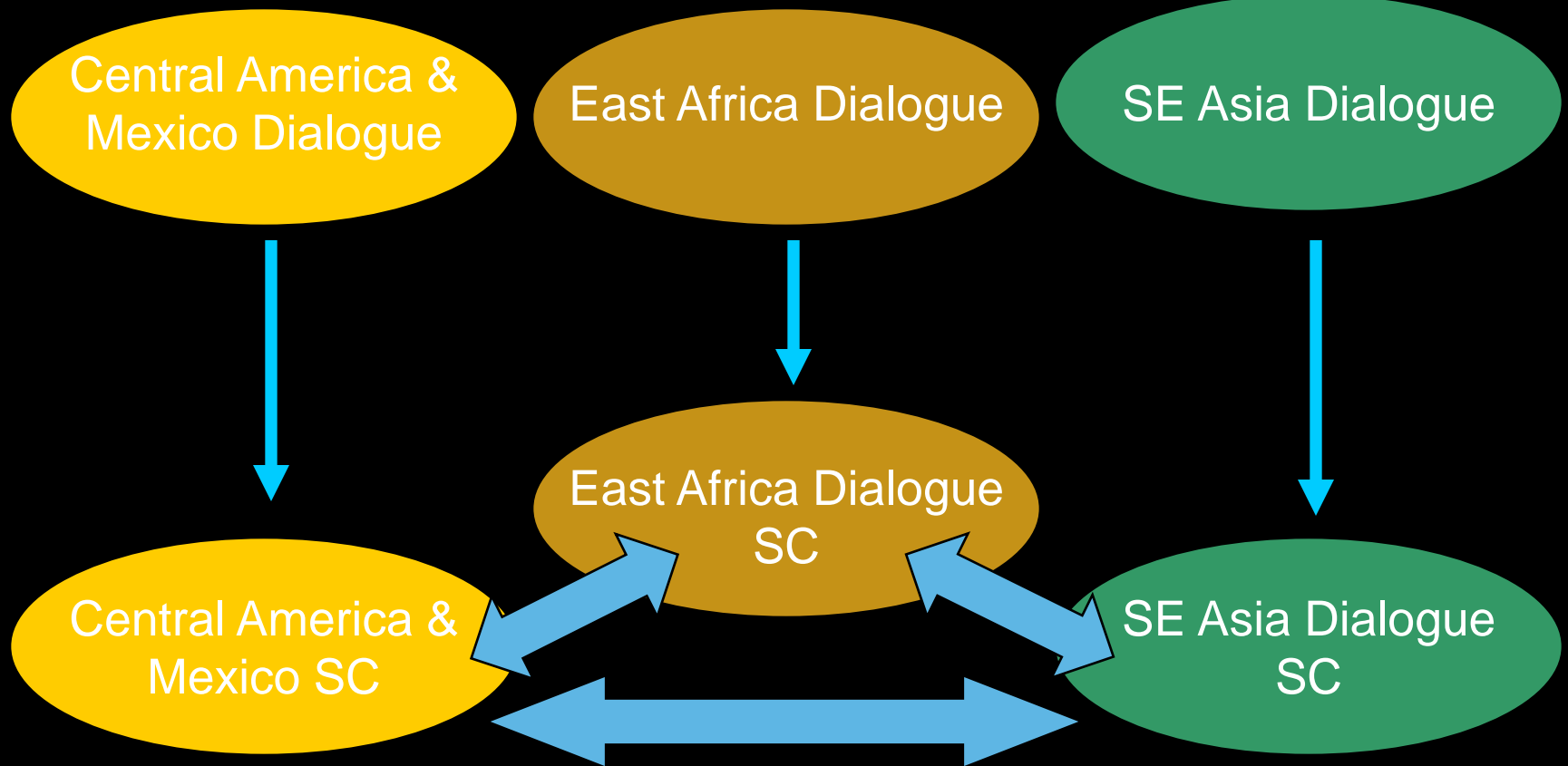
