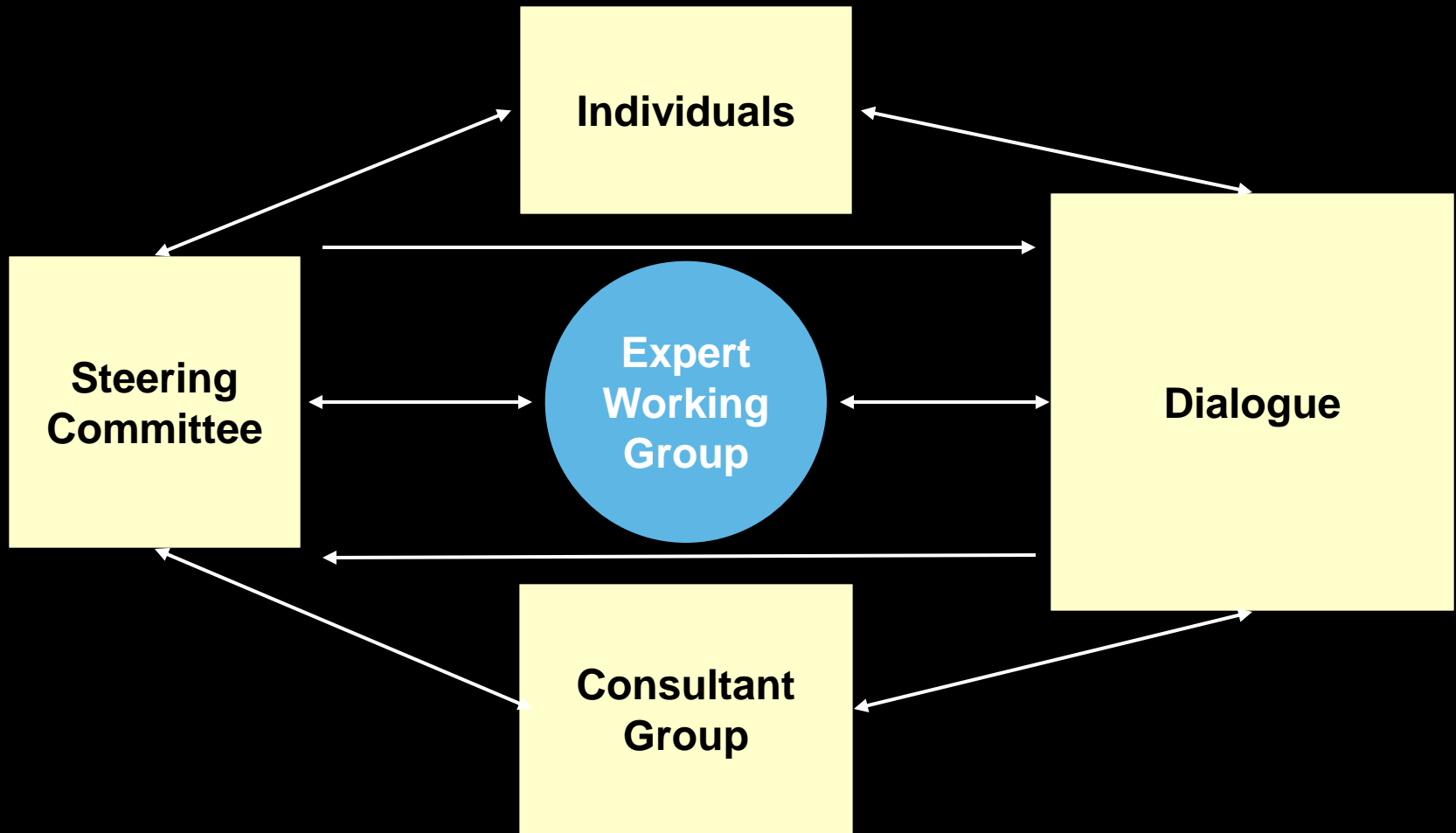

# The different levels of participation in the “Aquaculture Dialogue”





# All the stakeholders can participate

- The “Dialogue” or Round Table
  - Meeting of all interested stakeholders. Participants support the objectives and can participate in and comment on the different projects of the Aquaculture Dialogue and other groups
- Working Groups
  - Made up of scientists who have recognized expertise in the field in question





# All the stakeholders can participate

- Consultant Group
  - Give advice on specific aspects or results of the Dialogue and collectively give corporate perspectives (e.g. distributor group, group representing government agencies, etc.)
- External stakeholders
  - Individuals who do not directly participate in the Dialogue (workshop) but can comment on workshop reports





# The Steering Committee leads the Dialogue

- Decision-making body of the Dialogue
- Represents different stakeholders and the region
- Each SC must agree on its decision-making method and document it





# Steering Committee Members

- Membership is open to all stakeholders
- Balance between industry and civil society players
- 10 people maximum
- Each member must allocate a certain amount of resources (time, money)
- All “modern” methods of communication can and will be used to work efficiently

# The Central America and Mexico Steering Committee

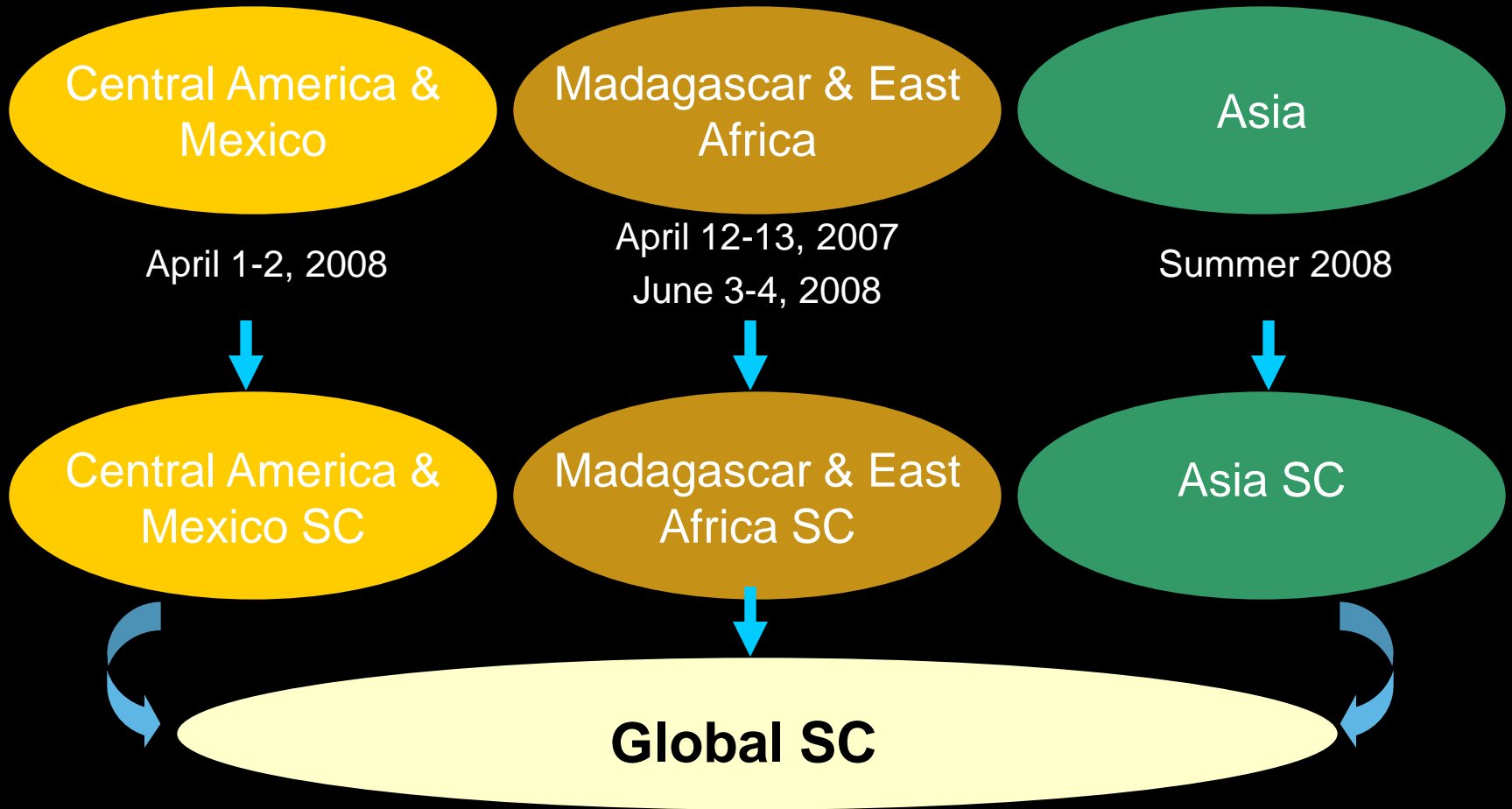
- 3 producers
